SUMMARY OF RESEARCH EXPERTISE

Dr. Peters is a labor economist and demographer with over 30 years of experience in social and family policy related research. Her work focuses on the role of the family as a social safety net, intergenerational transfers and elder caregiving, work-family balance, social investments in children/youth, father involvement, and the impacts of public policies on family outcomes. Her research has been widely published in journals of economics, demography, and sociology. She is co-editor of several books including *Marriage and Family: Perspectives and Complexities* and *From Welfare to Childcare: What happens to Infants and Toddlers when Single Mothers Exchange Welfare for Work*. For over ten years Peters was a partner in the NICHD funded Family and Child Well-being Network. She directed the Network's fatherhood efforts, and she was a member of the steering committee which guided the Federal Interagency Forum on Child and Family Statistics' Nurturing Fatherhood initiative. She recently completed a project on Women's Economic Empowerment in Low Income Countries and she is currently PI of a project examining the Impacts of State Paid Family Leave Policies for Family Caregivers of Older Adults.
