

Kinship Foster Parents Face Challenges Most Non-Kin Foster Parents Do Not Encounter

Kinship foster parents differ from non-kin foster parents in several important ways. Almost all of these differences illustrate that kinship foster parents face numerous challenges that most non-kin foster parents do not encounter. Moreover, private and voluntary kinship caregivers face similar challenges to kinship foster parents (Table 2).
